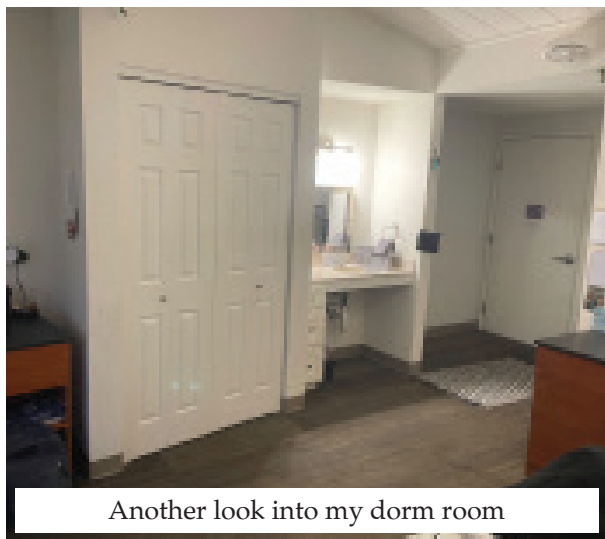
A Residence Hall dorm room at Arizona State University at Lake Havasu City
