enroll in a maximum of two courses (8 credits total) for just \$99 per course. Students are responsible for textbooks if the specific course requires one. This program is open to high school juniors and seniors who have a 3.0+ GPA. Eligible students may choose any 100-or 200-level course. Talk to your counselor about which courses may be used on your high school transcript. Start earning university credits while you are in high school!
